In 1521, the Spanish soldier Inigo Loyola's leg was shattered by a cannonball in the Battle of Pamplona and this was the beginning of a journey of conversion that led him to become St Ignatius of Loyola. The Cannonball Moment (celebrated 20 May Annually) led St Ignatius to see all things in Christ and as such, cannonball moments are experiences that force us to stop how we are living and invite us to live in a new way. In this spirit, the cannonball concert is a musical experience that seeks to increase an understanding of the Catholic Mass through a musical performance infused with the performance arts. The cannoball volume 1 concert is thus rightly themed Missae Misucae, Liturgia Canticorum! (The is in Music: Liturgy of Songs) Invites Romac Humbled Voices Catholic Joyful Melodies

oncert starts with loud sound of firing cannonballs. A member of the lignite Youth Choir Runs on stage as Soldier (Ignatious of Loyola) and falls injured. Father lobie approaches the stage at blesses the fallen soldier (conversion) and IYC starts the opening song

Thematic Narration of the introductory rites by the poet as the priest gestures to greet the altar and the people.

Greetings and welcome to the Cannonball concert, the Missae Musica, the Liturgy in Music, A witness to Unchanged faith, A witness to Unbroken tradition. are called together to celebrate the Memorial of the Lord in a single act of worship, for it is he that said, ere two or three are gathered in my name, there i am in their midst"

The Sacrifice of the Cross and its sacramental renewal in the Mass, which Christ the Lord instituted at the Last Supper and commanded the Apostles to do in his memory, are one and the same, differing only in the imanner of offering, and that consequently the Mass is at once a sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving, of propritation and satisfaction.

Mathew 5.24-25 So then, if you are bringing your offering to the altar and there remember that your brother has something against you leave your offering there before the altar, go and be reconciled with your brother first, and then come back and present your offering.

The Parish priest speaks of the gloria and invites the audience to listen in whilst Romac take to the stage

Ignite Choi

Parish Priest speaks of the essence of the profession of faith, the prayers of the faithful are displayed on the projector

So you should pray like this:

The Priest speak brief about peace and its christian relations. IYC does a short Rugare piece and Tapiwa Kapisa takes to stage and does a rendition of the peace

The day of Unleavened Bread came round, on which the Passover had to be sacrificed, and he sent Peter and John, saying. 'Go and make the preparations for us to eat the Passover.' They asked him, Where do you want us to prepare it?'

The man will show you a large upper room furnished with couches. Make the preparations there. They set off and found everything as he had told them and prepared the Passover.

The IYC Stays on stage to act as disciples in the enactment of the fraction with parish priest. Catholic Joyful Melodies comes to stage to sing a song of the Fraction (Chirairo) whilst the enactment is done without words.
